NOTICE OF REVISED FEE SCHEDULE

At the September 22nd board meeting, the Board of Commissioners approved a revised fee schedule for the Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control Permits. The following fee schedule is effective immediately.

<u>Residential Permit 12 Months</u>	<u>Fee (Round up to the nearest ¼ acre)</u>
Minor Permit (Less than 1 acre)	\$300.00
Major Permit (1 or more acres)	\$300.00 + \$150 per acre over one
<u>Residential Permit 18 Months</u>	
Minor Permit (Less than 1 acre)	\$400.00
Major Permit (1 or more acres)	\$400.00 + \$150 per acre over one
<u>Industrial/Commercial Permit</u>	
Minor Permit (Less than 1 acre)	\$500.00
Major Permit (1 or more acres)	\$500.00 + \$200 per acre over one
<u>Mining Operation Permit *</u>	
Minor Permit (Less than 2 acres)	\$500.00
Major Permit (2 or more acres)	\$500.00 + \$50 per acre over two
<u>Utility Permit</u>	
Minor Permit (Less than 1 mile)	\$400.00
Major Permit (1 or more miles)	\$400.00 + \$50 per mile over one
<u>Annual Renewal of Existing Permit</u>	
Mining Permit	\$300.00
All other renewals	Same as initial fee

*Mining operation includes all excavations for the purposes of removing and/or selling materials including the construction of ponds and /or lakes.

If a regulated activity is started prior to obtaining a permit, all fees are doubled and violators are subject to receiving a civil infraction (ticket). Civil infractions are \$100 for 1st offense, \$500 for 2nd offense, \$2,500 for 3rd offense and a flagrant infraction is subject to restitution of the sight and a \$10,000 fine.

I have included a copy of our current permit. You can download copies from our website at, www.saginawcounty.com/PublicWorks/Permits-and-Forms.aspx. Please discard any old permits that you may have and replace them with this updated permit.

If your activity covers five or more acres, a state notice of coverage is also required from the EGLE. Although once you have a permit from the Public Works Office and send in the notice of coverage to the state, you are free to start the earth change.
