**RESOLUTION No. 18-02  
POVERTY GUIDELINES 2018**

**WHEREAS,** the adoption of guidelines for poverty exemptions is within the purview of the Township; and

**WHEREAS,** the homestead of persons who, in the judgment of the Board of Review, by reason of poverty, are unable to contribute to the public charges is eligible for exemption in whole or in part from property taxation under Public Act 390, 1994 (MCL 211.7a); and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to PA 390, 1994, the Township of Kochville, Saginaw County, adopts the following guidelines for the Assessor and Board of Review to implement. The guidelines shall include but not be limited to the specific income and asset levels of the claimant and all persons residing in the household, including any property credit returns, filed in the current or immediately preceding year; and

**WHEREAS,** changes to these guidelines may be made by the Township of Kochville.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, THAT THE POVERTY EXEMPTION POLICY,** including Calculation Worksheet and Application, which are attached to this Resolution, are hereby approved and adopted.


